## [ Coach's Report ]

**As the summer speeds past us and we grapple with the uncertainty of what the coming fall semester will look like,** I wanted to take the time to reflect on the past year. This is typically an opportunity to recap the race results of the spring season and while there isn't much to report in that respect, much was still accomplished and learned in the past 12 months.

The headline of the year will unfortunately be the cancellation of the spring season due to the coronavirus. The pandemic is the all-encompassing

and overwhelming challenge facing the world, and specifically the US, right now and little space remains to keep the spotlight fixed on anything other than the daily numbers and changing plans to reopen. But the team took some giant steps forward this past year that need to be recognized, celebrated, and engrained into who we are going forward.

We had a successful and motivating fall racing season with great results at the Head of the Charles and the Princeton Chase. A totally new varsity 8+ charged down the course at the Charles, leading the university entries at the first check point and finished 2nd within striking distance of Yale. Most encouraging were the margins to the rest of our main competition with 8 seconds to Brown, 9 seconds to Harvard, 12 second to Washington, and 29 second to Princeton. The result added to the momentum that had already been building through the fall semester of training and gave the whole squad a boost. As we have in recent years, we sent a top Freshman 8+ to the Princeton Chase to give that group a focal point in the fall and a chance for them to race with the block C on their chests. The Freshman event was eliminated this year after our crew won it five years in a row, so the crew raced twice in the Varsity 8+ events and finished 5th and 4th, notably only 9 seconds behind the Washington varsity in the first round of racing.

After a consistent winter of training we started the spring season with two sets of racing in Las Vegas and Newport beach on February 29th. The Varsity and Junior Varsity travelled to Vegas to race against Dartmouth and Oregon State; these early races are always great learning opportunities and we came



away from the weekend with four solid victories and many lessons learned about how to race efficiently over a 2000m course. The Third Varsity and Freshmen lineups travelled to Newport and went undefeated in a series of round-robin races over 1250m in the morning before meeting each other in the final with the Freshmen edging the 3V by a deck.

These results were the outward highlights of a successful fall and winter of training, but the real progress was made in the daily training mentality and team energy

that grew through the early months of training. The team very quickly became a cohesive and fun unit and the intra-squad racing that we had every Saturday morning with five mixed 8+s across being the weekly showcase of our team culture. Performance on race day is simply an extension of what we do as a squad in training.

I'm proud of how the squad as a whole has taken control of what they want this experience to be. This has been led by the upperclassmen in the group but it has been an authentic shift in the team because everyone, no matter the class, has felt empowered to have a voice and to provide the example of who we want to be in training, racing, academics, and as a teammate.

Academically, we have continued our upward trajectory and achieved the highest team GPA that Cal Men's Rowing has ever seen. We started the fall by winning the Newmark award for the top average GPA for a large men's team at Cal with a cumulative 3.10 for the second year in a row. The team proceeded to have our best fall semester in recent memory with a 3.31 team GPA and followed that up with a 3.70 GPA in the spring semester to increase our overall cumulative GPA to a 3.29 which is the highest for any men's team at Cal. Given the challenges of adjusting to online learning in different time zones all over the world, I think these accomplishments are incredible and I'm very proud of the team for continuing our focus on academic excellence. Winning the Newmark award for the third year in a row will be a great achievement for the squad and only sets the expectation that we will continue this positive trend in the classroom.

The entire team felt the loss of the cancelled spring season but none more than our Senior class. There was prolonged uncertainty around whether an

extra year of eligibility would be granted and which Master's or Graduate Certificate programs would be available to this group. Many of the seniors are well-positioned to take advantage of their extra year and race for Cal next spring but whether that comes to fruition or not, I want to thank Will Creedon, Matt Mesman, Brett Cataldo, Brett Vilks, Jack Smith, Charlie Ryan, Danny Jordan, and Sam Champion for the impact that they have had on this team over the past four years.

I continue to be extremely grateful for everything that Sam Baum and Brandon Shald bring to the coaching staff; their impact on the energy and attitude of the crew and our recruiting efforts are so clearly evident. Jay Peart keeps us all grounded in sarcasm and focused on the details that keep the boathouse running smoothly. I appreciate all of their support and efforts.

We are in a tenuous time for college athletics with athletic department budgets getting stretched in all directions. Announcements like Stanford cutting 11 sports, including their men's rowing program, only emphasizes our need to endow our program in the coming years. The work of the Friends of Cal Crew, led by Steve Dettlinger and the Rogers family, make this life-changing experience of studying and rowing at Cal possible for generations to come; I want extended a heartfelt thank you to Andy Rogers and everyone else that supports the program!

The coming year will be a strange one as we adapt and react to the ups and downs of the coronavirus spread in California and around the world. I am confident that there will be a spring racing season and an IRA Championship next May; the team that best navigates the uncertainty of the next 6-9 months and trains undeterred (from anywhere in the world) towards the IRA will be in the best position to win.

## [ A Word From Our President ]

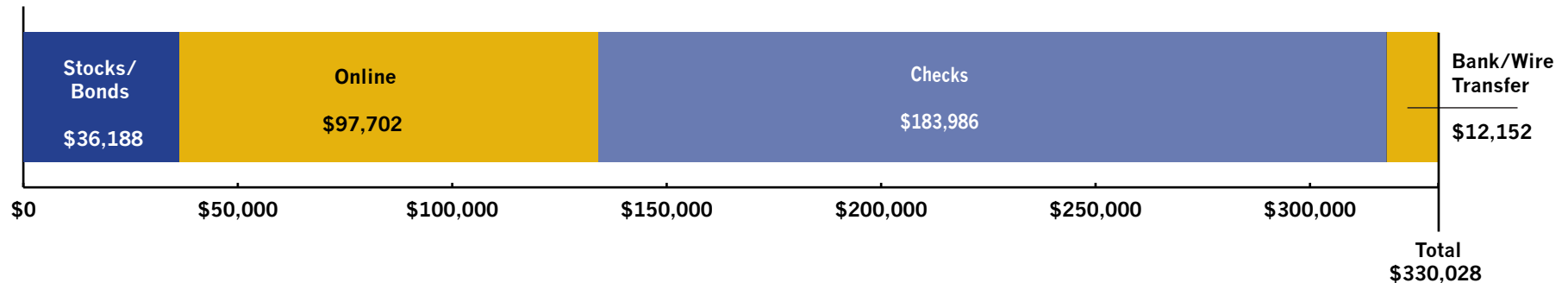
## [ Fundraising Report ]

**Upon reflection of the finished 2020 rowing season and financial year, moments of great triumph and disappointment are apparent.** We began with great excitement and joy as the team had some fantastic early season results. Alternatively, we also felt extreme disappointment as the racing season and a number of our staple events were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Nevertheless, the cancellation of the season did not stop our devoted community of alumni, parents, and friends from pushing through to make the 2020 financial year another successful one. Despite the necessary cancellation of events such as Spring racing, the annual auction, and Alumni Day, the Cal Crew Community came together to raise over \$300,000 from 750 gifts. These funds were enough to cover our program financially for another season. Among the uncertainty felt across the world, this figure is a testament to the dedication of our community and its commitment to this team. While the spring was unfortunately not given a chance to unfold, a productive fall has expanded our community and set the team up for success in the upcoming season. We continue to look optimistically towards the future and would like to take this time to reflect on some of the exciting moments that took place this year.

Fall generally begins with the excitement of seeing old friends again after a long summer, new classes to take, and a fresh batch of teammates looking to try and make their mark. This year was no different as the Friends of Cal Crew welcomed the parents of incoming freshmen over brunch at Gather followed by the new student-athletes moving into the dorms. This event provided a great platform for Head Coach Scott Frandsen and Friends President Steve Dettlinger to welcome the new families into our community and outline what lies ahead for their sons. Coach Frandsen used this time to answer

any questions the new parents had about their sons' transition to college life and rowing at the college level. Additionally, Mr. Dettlinger spoke about the Friends and the importance of our role and fundraising for the continuation of the program. Each year the parents of Cal Crew are a crucial part of our community and we believe it is important to establish this sentiment early on. Our parents contribute an enormous amount to the program each year. This year's donations from parents totaled to over \$81,000.

We hosted a new event early this season for the Alumni at the T. Gary Rogers Boathouse. The Alumni Banquet was a huge success where guests had the opportunity to meet members of the team while enjoying drinks and hors d'oeuvres on the balcony overlooking the estuary. This was followed by a formal dinner where stories were shared of past crew experiences. This inaugural event was a great success and we hope it will become a core feature on our yearly events calendar.

We were back to tradition with the tailgate, which is always an exciting start to the regular Friends of Cal Crew events for the year. This season, we welcomed alumni, parents, and Cal Crew supporters to the football game against WSU. Attendees met in Wurster courtyard on campus a couple of hours before kickoff for a chance to see old friends and meet new ones while

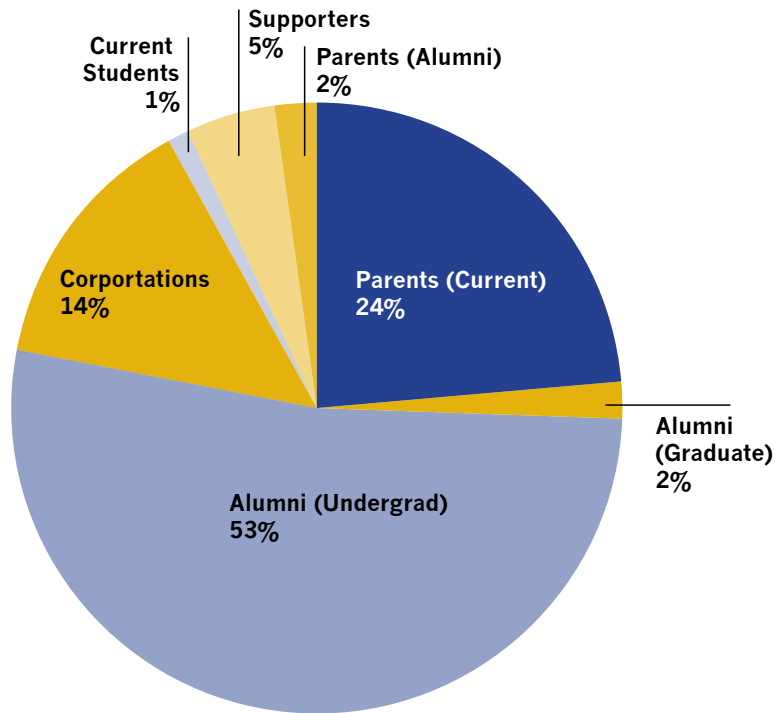
enjoying finger food and beer. During halftime, the 1964 Varsity 8+ was recognized on the field as part of their induction into the Cal Hall of Fame. The Friends of Cal Crew hosts a tailgate event each year to help build and strengthen our community.

For the past three years, we have devoted a full day in the Fall toward giving back to our East Bay Community. That day is Giving Tuesday. On the 3rd of December, each member of the team travelled to one of 6 different sites around Oakland and Berkeley to volunteer their time. This effort focused on environmental sustainability, elderly care, nutritional health, and youth support, which culminated in over 120 man-hours of community service. You, our supportive and generous community, supported us in this endeavor and helped raise over \$45,000 from more than 100 donations. Thank you again to everyone who donated on Giving Tuesday!

After the winter break, the team was back on campus and began preparations for the fast approaching racing season. The crews were able to compete at two regattas in late February: the Lake Las Vegas Invitational and the UC Challenge in Newport. The crews swept the field in a weekend of undefeated racing, establishing a solid position from which to attack the harder races to come. Unfortunately, it was shortly after these races that the severity

of the pandemic became clear, resulting in the cancellation of our annual fundraising Dinner and Auction scheduled for early March. The season was ultimately cancelled the following week. Despite this disappointment, fundraising continued as we sought to fill the gap left by the cancelled event in order to pay for scholarships for the student-athletes. The Big Give, our second 24-hour fundraise-a-thon in the 2020 season and a campus wide event, was a huge success, resulting in nearly \$70,000 worth of donations! As a result, our program raised the most money out of all the other teams in the Athletic Department.

As awareness of COVID-19 increased, so did the questions about its impact on the team now and into the future. To help answer some of these questions and further engage the crew community, Coach Frandsen organized several Zoom calls to alumni, parents, and supporters. These online Q&A sessions proved to be very popular and informative, with viewers joining in from around the world to hear the latest updates. There are still a number of questions surrounding how next season will unfold with regard to the crew season and we look forward to the possibility of future Zoom calls when plans become more concrete.

The 2020 season was certainly an unusual one, yet despite the adversity we faced as a team, it was still successful. We received over 750 donations throughout the course of the year, 115 of which were from people who had not donated in 2019. Although we may not have raised as much as other years, we did increase our community contact list by over 100 people. These figures tell us that our community is growing in conjunction with the commitment to keeping Cal Crew Forever. We are looking forward to the day when we can have in person events again, but we are also devoted to ensuring the safety of the Cal Crew Community.
